# Opening Activity

- Share Museum Resources about Juneteenth and Kwanzaa.
- Have students brainstorm different ways to Celebrate.
- Important Points: Music, Food, Pride.

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## **Group Activity**

- Read aloud (again) the book THE MUSEUM OF ME. <u>Previously</u>: Explain to students that each one has something that is special. If we made a museum in our classroom, what ONE thing would you bring to put in the museum? Have students draw a picture of their item and explain the Show and Tell presentation plan. Give each student a bag to decorate for their item which must fit in the bag. Send home Parent Information.
- Remind students of the 4 Rules of Museum Etiquette. Have students prepare to share (Show & Tell) their Museum Bags with the class. Discuss how the item would be presented in a museum. Help students construct a (verbal) label for the item.


### Individual Practice

Have each student create a section of the celebration flag which will hang over their Museum Items.


